There will be a SATs meeting for parents and **Year 6 pupils on Monday 27th February at 4:30pm**

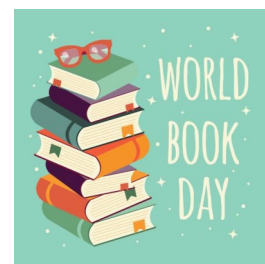

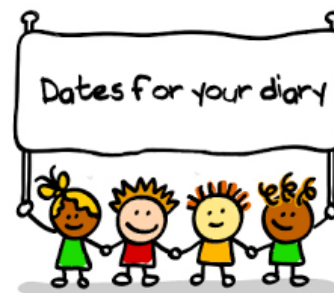

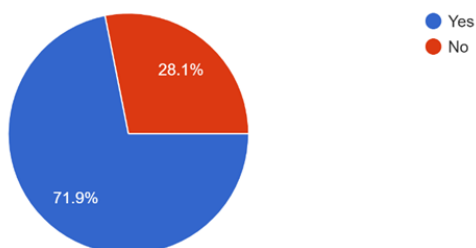

In the week before half-term we had a big focus on On-line safety. Children in Years 3 -6 undertook a questionnaire. Here are the responses:

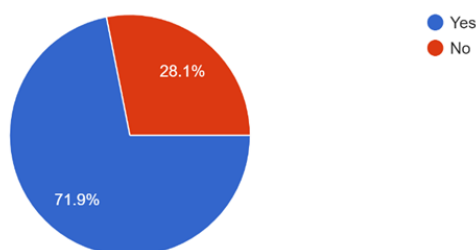
Do you play games online with other players?

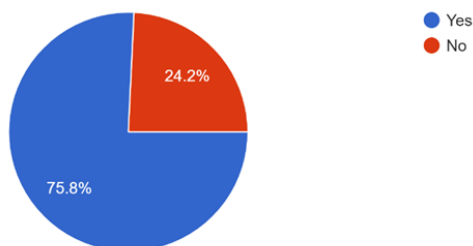
Do you play games online with other players?

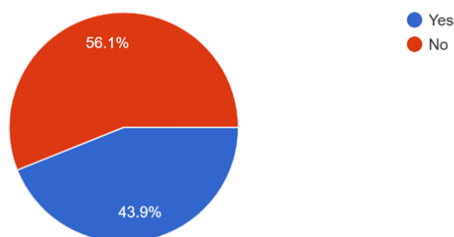
Do you play online games with your school friends?

66 responses



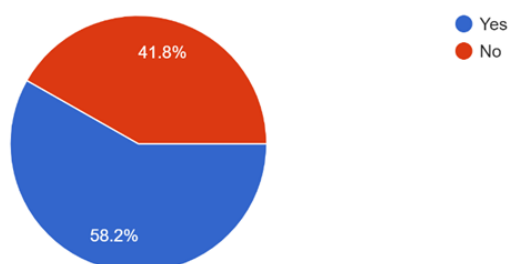
Have you ever spoken (talked or typed) to someone you do not know online?

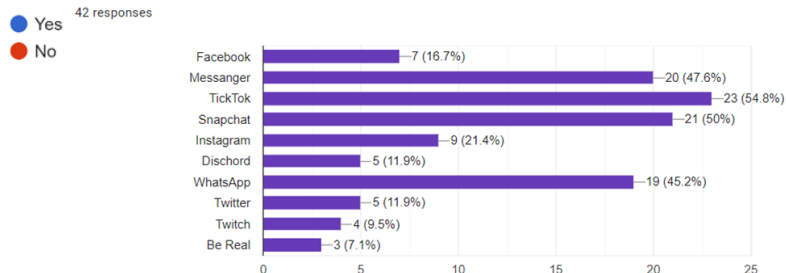
Do you know how to block or report someone online?

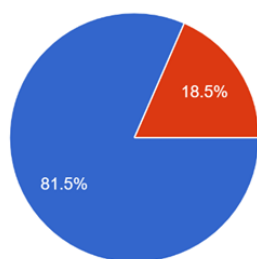
Which social media platform do you have access to?

Do you now that some social media platforms have age limits?

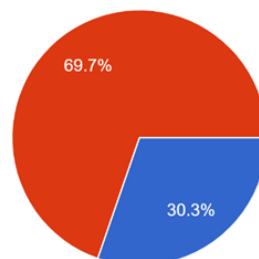

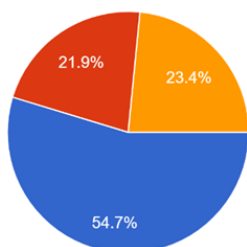

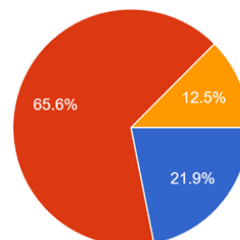

Do your parents ask you what you do online?

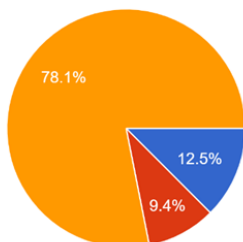

Do you have a Safe Search filter at home?

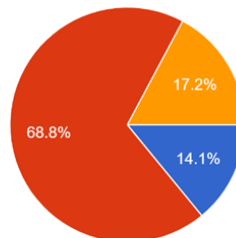

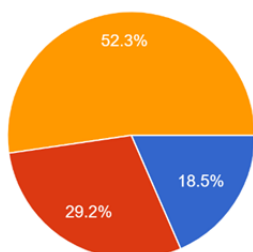

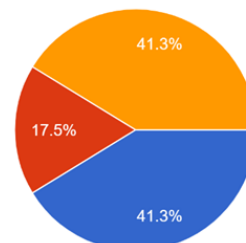

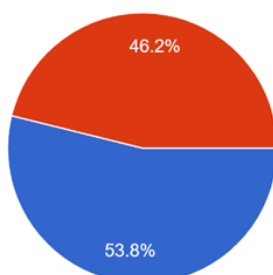

Clearly, being on-line is part of the world the children are growing up in so it is important to educate them to use technology safely. I did a special assembly with Class 3 and Class 4 separately, to address age appropriate issues. My main message to the children was that parents are the key to keeping safe on-line. Sharing with you which sites and apps they use and allowing you to regularly check their phones / tablets will help to keep them safe.

We talked about communicating and playing with others on-line and I reminded them that 'A friend of a friend is a stranger.' As 43.9% of children said they have spoken to someone they don't know on-line, this is clearly something to monitor.

Sometimes, we hear of inappropriate games that children have come across. Recently children have talked about 'Game Master' this is not at all appropriate for children, it is very dark and quite scary. 'Huggy Wuggy' is another frightening character. Unfortunately, TikTok and You Tube makers use these characters to create unsettling videos. Even if children haven't seen them, they may hear about them from others.

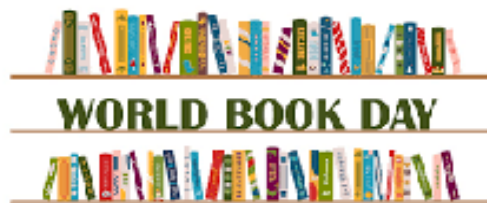
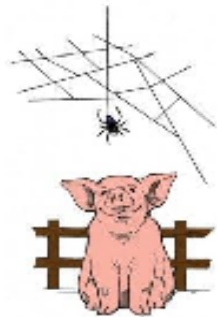
