Dear Parents,

Welcome to bumper edition of the newsletter as we have lots of exciting opportunities for the children to share with you.

I was so impressed with the super 'Aim High' and "Be Resilient' attitude of all the children who attended the cross country event at Holsworthy College last Monday. 
