Dear Parents,

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We have a busy week for staff as a number are involved in First Aid training. I am also on a two day course on Wednesday and Thursday. Any urgent matters will be handled by Miss Miners or Mrs Rothery. I will follow up any non-urgent matters when I return.

Home-Learning

A huge thanks to the many parents who have now contributed to the survey. In total we had 48 responses which, if we count siblings, totals 60 pupils across the Federation.

Around a third of parents felt the on-going tasks helped children with their learning, around another third were unsure and a further third felt it had not helped. It is very important for us to be reflective of your views and whilst we still want Home-Learning to focus on fundamental skills, we feel that the children need something else in addition that will be exciting, engaging and allow parents to see and support their progress, whilst not being onerous on your home-life balance or on teachers' work-life balance.

Therefore we are in the process of purchasing Mathletics for all the children (though Reception and Y1 will have a slightly different version adapted for their age.) Mathletics is an online platform of maths activities aligned with the National Curriculum. Teachers will set weekly tasks that the children need to complete and there will also be lots of other challenges children can access to extend themselves. Mathletics has videos and pictoral representations of the methods used in school so both you and your child will have a clear understanding of the method. It can be accessed on a phone, tablet or laptop. Mathletics can also be used by teachers in school as part of children's lessons. For children in Years 3 - 6 and those in Year 2 who have completed the Read, Write Inc. programme, we are purchasing Oxford Reading Buddy. It is an on-line reading platform which will help children's reading and comprehension in a fun and motivating way. Here is a video about Oxford Reading Buddy: https://youtu.be/hr9wirOTVIw

We hope these two platforms will be up and running in the next couple of weeks. In the meantime, teachers will set spellings for Year 1 upwards, times tables / numbers activity and children need to read 5 x per week. Once the platforms are place, weekly home-learning will look like this:
