Dear Parents,

Jon Galling, the Senior Safeguarding Officer for DCC delivered a fantastic Internet Safety Workshop last Thursday. Parents who attended, reported it was very useful and practical. Jon was incredibly human and did not lecture us at all, instead he helped us see things from our children's point of view. As the essence of the session was in Jon's delivery, it is impossible to fully replicate this, however, I will share snippets in the Safeguarding section of the newsletter over the next few weeks so please do look at these. North Dartmoor Search and Rescue Team, Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> May

We have arranged for North Dartmoor Search and Rescue to visit our school. They will bring in equipment and the mountain rescue vehicles for the children to look at as part of this visit and talk to them about their work.

In addition, Year 5 and 6 pupils will be taught

basic First Aid from Carl Tinkler, who volunteers for North Dartmoor Rescue Team and delivers First Aid


preparing children with the basic First Aid skills when they really count will give our children confidence in how to deal with potential situations they may meet as they become more independent.

We are in such a privileged position living so close to Dartmoor National Park. We think it is a great opportunity to raise awareness of the beauty of our local environment and a great way to acknowledge the work of the volunteers of the North Dartmoor Search and

Rescue Team. Therefore, we are asking for a £1 donation, payable on SchoolMoney. This will go to North Dartmoor Search and Rescue Team, which is a registered charity and is 100% dependent on donations from the public. The team excels during extreme weather events when its intervention frequently saves lives.

#### Music Lessons

Ruth Hayes has two more Recorder sessions with Class 3, so the last will be on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May. She will then begin Class 4 Recorder lessons on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> May.















#### Statutory Assessments

There are some assessments which are statutory so all schools are obliged to administer these. The tests are all set externally by the DfE and results form part of your child's record. If your child is in one of the year groups below they will be taking a statutory assessment this term. Results will be shared with you in their end of year report.

#### Year 6

#### Year 4

Year 4 children will undertake an on-line Multiplication Check. This is carried out one-to-one with a teacher overseeing. This will take place between Monday 5<sup>th</sup> June and Friday 16<sup>th</sup> June. To support children, please encourage them to learn their times tables and use Times Tables Rockstars frequently.

#### Year 2

Year 2 will sit SATs tests for the End of Key Stage 1. Due to the age of the children, we try to make these feel like an end of term assessment that they are already used to and the children usually enjoy the challenge and rise to it. These will take place in the week of 15<sup>th</sup> May. There will be four tests during the week: Arithmetic, Maths Reasoning and two Reading papers. To support your child, please keep the 5 reads a week going and talk about the text with them to help their understanding. We will soon be introducing 'Reading Buddies' which will help further. Please continue to encourage your child to use 'Mathletics'.

#### Year 1

Year 1 will undertake a Phonic Screening Check in the week of 12<sup>th</sup> June.. This is a one-to-one assessment with a teacher and tests their ability to read single words using their decoding and blending skills which they are taught during Read, Write Inc sessions. There will also be some nonsense words included. To support your child, keep hearing them read the 'Read, Write Inc' books and encourage them to sound out (or 'Fred Talk') rather than guessing the words.

#### **Reading Buddies**

Yesterday we held a parent meeting to introduce Reading Buddies. It is for those children who are not on the Read, Write Inc scheme. It is an on-line resource of e-books that your child will move through according to their level. They will choose a 'Buddy' character who asks them questions about the text as they move through. From this week, children will be able to use Reading Buddies at home. We suggest that Reading Buddies forms 2 or 3 of your child's '5 Reads per Week' and the rest are from a physical book. Please continue to note the 5 Reads in your child's reading records. Information on how to join Reading Buddies from home will be sent to you separately.

Following a question raised by parents regarding whether there is an app to download, please see the response from our Oxford Reading Buddy trainer: "There isn't an app for ORB, parents need to go to the web address in their browser, preferably using Chrome, although other browsers are supported. ORB has been fully optimised to be used on a mobile phone or tablet, if this is the devise children are using, so there shouldn't be any issues with children being able to view the eBooks."

#### Maths Workshop for Parents, Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May, 4:30 pm at Halwill School



Our home-learning questionnaire, indicated that a number of parents would like a workshop to support them with the current methods of teaching Maths. We are very aware that if we were not in schools ourselves, we would find the methods completely alien to those we were taught.

Mrs Batstone, our Maths Lead, will be leading this session. Don't worry, there will be no tests! But hopefully you will come away with a clearer understanding of how to support your child. It is suitable for parents of children in any class in the Federation.

before Easter. It includes a list of prizes for children based on the amount that they raise. However, there is no obligation for the children to raise money and they will take part in the assembly and the fitness sessions regardless.











#### Holiday Requests

Please see the following message which we have been asked to share with you by Devon County Council:

We believe that in order for a pupil to fully benefit from their education, good attendance is crucial.

As of September 2013, an amendment to the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2006 came in to force and greater clarity was introduced to the issue of schools authorising absence requests. These changes reinforced the Government's view that every minute of every school day is vital and that pupils should only be granted authorised absences by the school in 'exceptional circumstances'.

A family holiday is not normally considered by the Government to be an 'exceptional circumstance' and therefore will not be authorised by the school.

Should you choose to take your child out of school without the authorisation of the school, then Parental Responsibility Measures could be instigated. This could mean receiving any of the following;

- A Penalty Notice
- A summons to the Magistrate Court which could result in a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a term of imprisonment for up to 3 months.

Schools are required to notify the Local Authority if a pupil has a number of unauthorised absences. Unauthorised absences can be acquired when;

- 1) Leave has been requested, but the circumstances are such that the school is unable to authorise the leave and it is taken anyway.
- 2) Leave is not requested and/or the school has grounds to believe that the child has been taken out of school for an avoidable reason (example a family holiday). Only the Head teacher can authorise an absence. This year there have been occasions when schools have been notified that the pupil is sick, but the school later discovers and reasonably believes that the reason given for the absence is not genuine.
- 3) A child continually arrives late after the registration period has closed.

Schools need to notify the Local Authority in all of the circumstances listed above.

Should a Penalty Notice be issued as a result of unauthorised absence then one notice will be issued to each parent/carer for each child involved. Currently, each Penalty Notice is for £120, which is reduced to £60 if paid within the first 21 days. If a Penalty Notice goes unpaid after 28 days, then court proceedings will be initiated.

We understand the disappointment that the refusal of a leave request may cause, but as you can appreciate this policy represents the school's responsibility and commitment towards providing your child's education and supporting their future life opportunities.
