Aim High; Be Resilient; Take Care of Each Other

Dear Parents,

I hope you had an enjoyable extended weekend.

A huge well done to Y5 children who passed their Bikeability assessment with flying colours! They explained articulately, in assembly, what the course involved and what they have learned to cycle safely.



In assembly last week, I spoke to the children about Easter and Lent and compared this with Eid and Ramadhan, where fasting or giving up something is a key feature of Ramadhan and Lent respectively. I showed children the dates used to break a fast and will give them the opportunity to taste the dates this Friday. **Please let the office know if your child cannot eat dates.**

COVID - Remote Learning

A reminder that the Government guidance changed on 1st April.

- children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.
- **adults** with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for **5 days**, which is when they are most infectious. For **children** and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be **3 days**.

We have received information from County that their recommendation would be that where operational issues prevent children from attending on-site a remote learning offer should be made by schools (e.g. school closure because lack of staff to open safely).

County would not expect schools to provide remote learning while pupils are off school because they are unwell with Covid/Flu.

However, in agreement with Governors, as a Federation we feel that if children are well and off for the 3 days you can request work to be set and teachers will do so. Please make it clear to the office whether or not you would like work to be set. Please bear in mind that on the first day of absence, teachers may not be able to set work immediately as they will be in class.

Swimming Summer Term 2022

The children enjoyed their first session **but please can all swimmers to arrive in school by 8:50 am as the coach will be leaving promptly.** Delays will shorten the sessions for all children.

Please can children wear swimmers underneath their PE kits, when coming in to school, to make changing easier.

Year 6 SATs Week 9th May 2022

Across the country Year 6 children will be taking their statutory assessment tests (SATs) . This is an important week for the Year 6 children to showcase their personal best and 'Aim High' attitude. We appreciate that children will feel nervous and we will 'Take Care' of the children and try to make it as positive and calm experience as possible.

Please can families of children, of any age, be aware of this week and remind children for the need to be quiet in communal areas while the SATs take place. There will be notices on doors whilst the tests are going on. I will be overseeing the tests with Miss Miners. All tests must take place on the same day across the country. Mrs Gleed will teach Y5 children before the tests so Miss Miners can do some last minute revision with Y6 and help keep them calm and focussed. The majority of children will do the tests in their classroom, whilst a few who are eligible for arrangements will do them in the library. Miss Miners will inform children and parents if their child is having access arrangements.

It is important that your child attends next week for the tests but obviously if they are unwell or have COVID, they should not be in school (see above in COVID section). Please let us know as soon as possible (via the office NOT Class Dojo) as we will need to request a timetable variation from the Standards and Testing Agency for permission to administer the test on another day.

Times Tables Test

All Year 4 pupils across the country will be taking the statutory Times Tables test this term. This is the first year that it has become statutory and results will be submitted to the DfE and form part of the pupils' assessment record.

The test is on-line and children will have 25 random times tables questions to answer in 6 seconds per question. Children are working hard on their Times Tables and the positive of this test is it does focus on an area which is fundamental to accessing all areas of maths. Please keep working on Times Tables with your children. Sometimes it can be helpful to work out which individual Times Tables they don't know and really practise these e.g. 6x6, 6x7, 6x8. Therefore, I am asking that you please **book your Morning Club place on School Money by Friday for the following week**. If you have **an absolutely last minute need, please book by 3.00 pm the day before you need the club**.

I thank you for this, as you will be supporting us to balance our work and family needs as we support you with yours.



📢 **NEWS:** We're working with partners to investigate 111 cases of sudden onset liver inflammation (hepatitis) in children aged 10 and under across the UK. 🗣️ 📺

This is from the UK Health Security Agency.

We're working with partners to investigate 111 cases of sudden onset liver inflammation (hepatitis) in children aged 10 and under across the UK. Information gathered through our investigations increasingly suggests that this rise in sudden onset hepatitis in children is linked to adenovirus infection. But we are thoroughly investigating other potential causes. If your child develops the common mild symptoms of adenovirus infection like mild respiratory symptoms or diarrhoea, the chance of them developing hepatitis is extremely low. However, we're advising parents & guardians to be alert to the signs of hepatitis (incl. jaundice) & to contact a healthcare professional if they are concerned. Routine hygiene practices such as supervising children as they wash their hands and good respiratory hygiene help to reduce the spread of many common infections including adenovirus. If your child is experiencing symptoms of gastrointestinal infection such as vomiting and diarrhoea they should stay at home & not go back to school or nursery until 48 hours after the symptoms have stopped.
