He will talk to the children and read from some of his books and there will be an opportunity for the children to ask questions.

Tiny Travels – Black History Month Activity for Class 1

On the morning of Tuesday 18th October, Scallywags Pre-School have organised for Tiny Travels activities to take place in the Parish Hall as part of Black History Month. They have kindly invited Halwill Class 1 to join. School staff will accompany the children to the hall and as you have already completed permission for local walking trips, you won't need to complete a form for this. There will be no cost to parents for this as the School are covering our share of the costs.

Tiny Travels mission is to help children in Devon, a county where cultural diversity is minimal, learn about different countries and cultures through fun, hands-on experiences. There will be an African area to help children learn about the vibrant and diverse cultures of the African continent.

With the colourful photos and fun facts of the backdrops bringing the countries to life, children can also explore crafts, instruments, and play foods to learn about different cuisines. In each country area, there are musical buttons to hear different musical styles found in that country as well as smelling pots for a fully immersive experience including authentic, child-safe, crafts, trinkets, fabrics and flags. Everything has been selected with very young children in mind

 Smelling sensory pots with dried teas, spices and herbs from around the world

 Sound buttons with different music, language and anthem recordings

 Custom-made play food to learn about different cuisines

 Puzzles and open-ended play items with themes from different countries

 Books written by authors across Africa to suit different age levels

Harvest Festival Friday 21st October, 9:15 am

We are pleased to be able to invite parents and wider family to our Harvest Festival. Miss Squire is working with the children on their singing of 'Autumn Days' and 'We plough the fields and scatter'. She has suggested that any extra listening to these songs at home or in the car is highly encouraged and will really help the children to learn the songs, the tune and the words. We will be collecting non-perishable foods and toiletries for the Holsworthy Food Bank.

Change of Use of Pedestrian Gate at Drop-Off and Pick-Up

The majority of parents and children enter and exit through the pedestrian gate to the right of the vehicle gates. This pedestrian gate is on a timer **and will continue to be used** with its current timings.

A handful of parents use the pedestrian path to the left of the drive near the Wild for Learning Area and the pedestrian gate at the end of this. However, this gate is a manual gate and has no timer on it. It requires someone to lock and unlock it before and after drop-off and pick-up. Anything that requires someone to lock and unlock manually is liable to human error so to avoid this risk, we have taken the decision to **keep this gate locked**. Apologies for any inconvenience but I hope you will understand the reason for this change.

Therefore, the only access to school site, moving forwards will be via the pedestrian gate to the right of the vehicle gates.

This is an opportunity to meet your child's teacher and discuss their academic and pastoral development and needs. This year we plan to return to live meetings but if any parent would prefer a virtual meeting, this will also be offered.

Nearer the time, you will be able to book your 10 minute slot, via the office.
