

Miss Frayn and the office staff are in the process of organising the Cross Country event to Great Torrington School (GTS) on 15th October, once coaches, staffing and risk assessments are complete a letter will be sent out. Places to this event are limited by GTS so the results of the Holsworthy competition will be used to invite children to this. GTS will not be extending the invitation to parent spectators on this occasion.

A huge thank you to Miss Frayn and the office staff for organising these events, which give the children added enrichment. A huge amount of behind the scenes organisation is involved, particularly when events are so early in the academic year and teachers are also busy settling in new classes and driving the curriculum forward.



As the additional Bank Holiday for the Queen's Jubilee on Friday 3rd June 2022, falls in half-term, Devon County Council have advised us that staff and children can have an additional day of holiday elsewhere in the year. Keeping Safe

In assembly the children were reminded about the purpose of staff and visitor badges or stickers – they mean that we know the visiting adult is in school and we have said they can be there. Staff badges mean we know they are safe adults who work in our Federation.

We also spoke about the Carey Quality 'Be Respectful' and reminded the children of not touching or borrowing other children's things without permission and whilst we encourage sharing, if someone doesn't want you to touch their special toy / pencil case etc. then we must 'Be Respectful'. In the same way, sometimes we are happy to hold hands or give someone a hug but if someone doesn't want to, we must 'Be Respectful' and understand that they are not comfortable. We should always feel able to say if someone, child or grown up, isn't respectful and tell a safe adult.

In this way we gently introduce the idea of children keeping themselves safe. Our Relationships and Sex Education policy and curriculum follow this theme in a gentle, child friendly approach. As you may well be aware, on the 1st October 2021 a new law with regard to packaged food labelling came into force in the UK. This law is called Natasha's Law. This follows an allergen incident, where a young girl sadly died after eating a food product containing sesame which was not labelled. The law coming into force now means that any packaged item for consumer consumption must now be labelled to provide the consumer a list of the contents of the item, with particular attention paid to allergens on the current 14 allergen matrix which should be marked in bold. This law affects all packaged foods and, therefore, affects anything homemade that would be donated to a fundraiser or similar event. Any homemade items would need to have a list of ingredients provided in order to comply with the law.

Due to Natasha's Law the catering team have now put in place a robust labelling of ingredients. Any item in a package will now have to carry a label.

All ingredients used for cookery activities will need to be shared with parents before the activity

Any items sent in for birthdays should be pre-packaged with full ingredients. Please do not send in home-made items.
