Purpose:

The Primary and allocated Secondary School should arrange a review meeting following receipt of this information to allow information to be exchanged and transition plans to be drawn up. The Transition Plan is the joint responsibility of primary schools and the receiving secondary school in conjunction with the child and their parents or carers. This checklist is designed to support educational settings, in Devon, with meeting the required standards to protect all its people from COVID-19 within that setting.

Mitigation:

• Both the Primary and Secondary schools will have their own Covid-19 risk assessments (RA100 V2.6) and mitigation processes in place, this checklist is to aid the schools covid-19 mitigations for the transitional, taster and open days. If either of the schools visiting or receiving are in an outbreak situation or have rising

number of cases, then the event would not be able to go ahead. It is the responsibility of both schools to keep each other appraised of each other's case numbers. It is vitally important that both staff, pupils and parents are briefed on what is expected of them to provide a safe and Covid secure event.
